## **Emergency Evacuation Procedure**

To ensure the safety of the children and myself, I have developed the following procedure for evacuating my home in the event of an emergency, such as a fire, flooding, or gas leak.

Children will regularly practice the evacuation procedure (at least once a month) to ensure they are familiar with the process and remain calm in the event of a real emergency. Drills will be carried out on different days of the week to ensure all children have the opportunity to participate, with all details recorded in the evacuation log.

## Procedure:

- 1. Sound the alarm to alert everyone to the emergency.
- 2. **Evacuate the children** using the safest and nearest exit available. Babies and toddlers will be carried to safety.
- 3. Take essential items:
  - Attendance record for the day
  - Contact numbers
  - Mobile phone
- 4. Assemble at the designated assembly points (in order of preference):
  - Assembly Point A Back Door
  - Assembly Point B Side Door
  - Assembly Point C Front Door
- 5. Contact emergency services as soon as possible.
- 6. **Comfort and reassure the children** to help them remain calm.
- 7. Arrange a safe location for the children to stay until parents can collect them.
- 8. Follow the instructions of the emergency services.
- 9. Do not return to the building until the emergency services have declared it safe to do so.

This procedure is reviewed regularly to ensure it is up-to-date and effective in maintaining the safety of all children in my care.
